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Message from the Head of School

Dear Parents

This week we have been busy hosting the visits of Miss Carole and Miss Paula who came for our CIS preparatory visit from Monday to Thursday. Carole and Paula have been talking to teachers, staff, management, parents, students and the Board during their visit. They have enjoyed speaking with everyone and we have learned a lot from them about what we will need to do to prepare ourselves for accreditation.

CIS is a very high quality accrediting agency that we are seeking full accreditation with. UDIS is already a CIS member school but we have identified that full accreditation offers us the opportunity to develop and align ourselves with the quality, best practices that CIS offers. This fits very well with our desire to create a top quality school for Udon Thani.



We have learned already that we may have been very ambitious with our timeline for getting accredited with CIS next year. There are many things that have been setup on the documents side, but CIS also expects those to be part of regular practice within the school which can only happen over time. The expectations that CIS sets are very demanding, as they should be, so it is not easy to meet them. We have also learned that we will need to make some changes to the school to regain some focus into what we are doing. The evaluators have asked us to examine more composite classes, rethink the subject specialties and consider bringing in more EAL students as some of the things we need to consider.

So, the process is a challenging one for us but it is also helping us develop a quality school here in Udon Thani. In sum, this means that we will certainly need to rethink our timelines for accreditation and then work out explicitly what we need to do to be able to meet the expectations that CIS has. We will certainly keep parents updated and look to consult with you about any changes as well.

Elsewhere at the school, our students have been busy learning about healthy eating as part of our healthy eating month at UDIS. At the assembly this week, students learned about the healthy eating groups and performed some fun activities to earn house points. This links back to our school vision of seeking to develop students who are healthy, thriving and ready to learn.

Inquiry corner

Learning to think critically may be one of the most important skills that today's children will need for the future. In today's global and rapidly changing world, children need to be able to do much more than repeat a list of facts; they need to be critical thinkers who can make sense of information, analyse facts, compare and then discuss their opinions.

The Primary Years Programme places a particular emphasis on development of thinking skills in students. In all of our planning we aim to give students an opportunity to engage in meaningful tasks that are based on real life situations. In this way they are required to think for themselves.

This kind of thinking is developed over time with practice, and many of our learning engagements are planned specifically for that purpose. Parents can support their children in developing thinking skills. Here is a list of ideas to try with your child:-

- Allow time for them to think, don't expect fast answers all of the time.
- Ask questions in a way that requires a thoughtful answer.
- Set up play scenarios that require thoughtful play -role playing for example.
- When you read together be sure to make conversation about story too.

Critical thinking often happens when children have time to practice making choices, and so it is probably a good idea to consider how your children can be given more of these kinds of valuable opportunities.

Year 2 class update - The final term has begun




MODERN LANGUAGES - THAI LANGUAGE


English as an additional language (EAL)


