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Message from the Head of School

Dear Parents

It is wonderful to see our students back for the 2018/2019 academic year. Over the two weeks before school began, teachers have been busy planning for the year ahead and seeing our students back makes this effort all worthwhile.

Since last year, we have put in place a number of new developments. Construction has completed on our walkway to the PY building, the outdoor foyer area and our upgraded EY playground. These additions are making an immediate impact on the school. Our new swimming pool is also under

construction and will be complete by Christmas. We have also put in place a new security guard on the gate and a new parent ID card system.

On the academic side, we are rolling out new systems to track our progress against the NCE standards for mathematics and English. These involve both improved internal systems and new external tests to measure student progress year on year. We are also working towards our PYP authorisation visit in March, 2019 and continue to work towards full CIS accreditation in 2020/2021.

Staff have also been busy with new training and all staff received first aid and CPR training at Bangkok Hospital. Thai teachers have been involved with Thai language training at Anglo Singapore International School and ISAT's Thai teacher training event at Ayutthaya over the break as well. We have trainings planned for new staff in the PYP and further whole staff training in EAL coming up too.

Parent involvement continues to be something we look to build on. We are inviting two parent representatives onto the School Board and will be finalising those members over the next month. We are also looking for class representatives for each class to formalise our Parents and Teachers Association (PTA). We are continuing with our Parent Cafe programme to provide fun, interactive education seminars for our parents to learn about what we do. We also welcome parents to volunteer within the classroom too.

So, this is a big year for us and the continued support of our school community is tremendously valued.


