Dear Parents

This week, we celebrated Wai Kru day at school. Wai Kru is the day of the year when Thai students show respect to their teachers. 
Inquiry corner



Summary of meeting held on Monday 10 September

At this meeting the school explained that the school's guiding statements help's the school make decisions and should guide any decisions the PTA makes too. The school explained the purpose of the PTA which is an important consultative and decision making body for the school.

The PTA is also a place where parents and teachers can come together to express their concerns and express suggestions for improving the school and a place where parents and teachers can get to know each other better. We hope you are appreciating our school nurse being on duty each morning and she is there to check if your child has any symptoms of hand foot and mouth disease and any flu like symptoms, such as RSV. However while she is there she is also available for any health related questions you may have.

At the moment, we would like all our parents to be aware of hand, foot and mouth disease (HFMD). If your child shows any symptoms, please keep them away from school, inform your classroom teachers and seek medical attention.

Hand, foot and mouth disease

What is it? - โรคมือเท้าปากคืออะไร

Despite its scary name, hand, foot, and mouth disease is a common, contagious illness caused by different viruses. It typically affects infants and children under age 5, but older kids and adults can catch it as well. Hand, foot and mouth disease can be unpleasant, but it will usually clear up by itself within 7 to 10 days. You can normally look after your child by yourself at home.

Health and Safety

How is it spread? - การแพร่กระจายของเชื้อ

The virus is spread by coughs and sneezes, and is also found in the faeces of infected children. Some children infected with the virus do not have symptoms but can still pass it to others.

เชื้อโรคจะแพร่กระจายผ่านการไอและจาม และพบได้ในอุจจาระของเด็กที่ติดเชื้อ โดยเด็กที่ติดเชื้อบางคนอาจจะไม่แสดงอาการของโรค แต่ เชื้อโรคนั้นยังคงสามารถแพร่กระจายไปส่คนอื่นๆได้

ls there any treatment? - วิธีรักษา

There is no specific treatment for hand, foot and mouth disease. It is usually a mild and self-limiting illness. If a child feels unwell paracetamol may help. Antibiotics and creams or ointments for the blisters are not effective. Children recover just as quickly without them.

โรคมือเท้าปากไม่มีวิธีรักษาที่แน่นอน แต่ปกติแล้วจะสามารถหายเองได้ โดยท่านสามารถรักษาไปตามอาการ เช่น หากเด็กรู้สึกไม่สบายให้ ทานยาพาราเซตามอล แต่ยกเว้นตุ่มที่เกิดขึ้นไม่สามารถรักษาด้วยยาฆ่าเชื้อ ครีมทาผดผื่น หรือขี้ผึ้งได้ ซึ่งเด็กจะดีขึ้นได้เองโดยไม่ต้องใช้ยา พวกนั้น

How long are children infectious? - เด็กสามารถมีเชื้อได้นานแค่ไหน

Children who are ill are infectious. Also they may carry the virus in their faeces for many weeks after they have recovered and so can continue to pass on infection.
