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Year 3/4 class update - Where we are in place and time

The learners have been enjoying these past few weeks and have taken part in many exciting activities. Our learners presented their models and Google Slide presentations on their assigned natural disasters to the class. We have come to the end of our unit on natural disasters, and how the community responds to these events, and we had 2 guest speakers and field trips relating to this topic. Dr. Lindsay presented to our class on his experience during the Christchurch earthquakes in New Zealand and we also had Mr. Jeff Nash from Rajabhat University as a guest speaker. He shared his engineering expertise with the students and presented on some of the engineering methods that are in use today to help reduce damage during natural disasters. For our field trip, we visited the Udon Thani Disaster Prevention Unit and Bangkok Hospital. Both organisations presented to our students on how they respond during natural disasters to help the community of Udon Thani.



In preparation for our Christmas event, our learners have been learning about the country of Belgium and how Belgians celebrate Christmas. Our learners were especially fascinated to learn that Belgium uses three different languages in their country and is known for having the world's best chocolates. In honor of Belgium our Year 3/4 learners have been making chocolates to sell at our Christmas booth and learning a Belgian folk dance to perform at this event.


