
Inquiry corner

Year 4- Learning How to Care for the Environment



Year 6/7 update By Ms Cynthia Thomas, Y6/7 Teacher

We are really enjoying inquiring into the diversity of living things. We started off by looking at something simple from our own environment. We looked at a frog, turtles, fish, crickets and some medicinal plants too. The purpose was to observe, to draw and to ask questions. We began to refine the questions and think about how to develop them into simple scientific inquiries. Everyone was truly engaged in their inquiry and a lot of understanding was developed.

On a less happy note, we also found out about the amount of destruction that plastic causes in the environment. This motivated all of us to consider what we can do to make a small difference to the situation locally.







Modern languages - Thailand/Thai history

In Thai class time we learn about Thailand and Thai history once a week. This week in Year 4, students have learnt a lot about Udon Thani history. To develop their knowledge and understanding we took Year 4 to the Udon Thani city museum. Students enjoyed learning about Udon Thani history and technology there.















Health and Safety

This week has seen a decline in the air quality around Udon Thani. The school has reacted by investing in air quality monitors and some air purifiers to test within class rooms. Last week saw

the air quality index (AQI) rise to a reading that was over 150, which meant that it was important that the children stay indoors as much as possible and only engage in light physical activity outside. Each morning, and again before lunchtime, the reading will be checked and the appropriate action will be taken based on the AQI indicator. PTA update - Summary of meeting held on Monday 25 February


The school opened the meeting and presented information about the PYP verification visit that is coming up on 21-22 March. The school has put information onto Facebook as part of a #PYP101 campaign. The school then reported back on the 1:1 device initiative from the last meeting. All the parents that took part were in support of the programme but were split on how they thought the programme could be actioned. The school will prepare information about both options to present to parents by 29 April. The school then discussed the parents code of conduct policy. This is an important policy to ensure that everyone within our community feels safe and welcomed. Lastly, the school rolled out the facilities survey that it hopes to use to gauge feedback from the community on the strengths and weaknesses of current facilities, and what they think are needed new facilities. This survey will be conducted with parents, teachers and students to gain their feedback into the school. The school encourages all stakeholders to take part in this survey.
