

Year 3 class update - Fun in the mud!

The final part of our third Unit of Inquiry focused on different materials and ways people use them to make buildings and structures. We explored the idea of sustainability, discovering that steel is non sustainable (meaning we will run out at some point), but wood is sustainable because we can grow more. We also explored the building material clay. Clay is natural, and when mixed with rice husks it can be very strong. We visited Gaia Ashram and learnt how to make clay bricks and how to plaster a wall made out of clay bricks. The students were risk takers getting their feet muddy when mixing the mud and they also had a great time!

For the end of unit showcase the children presented their work including their SketchUp designs, some wooden model houses they made and a clay brick house we made together. We also looked at some instructional videos and slideshows of what the students have learnt over the course of this unit.

Our next Unit of Inquiry has the central idea 'When interacting with natural habitats, humans make choices that have an impact on other living things'. We will begin by exploring what habitats are, how they are different and the same, and then lead into inquiring about how humans are changing these habitats, for better or worse. The learner profile attributes we will focus on include being caring, a good communicator and knowledgeable.



After we had written the plan with him, there was a time during the week to develop the story into something quite special. In our English lessons will continue writing these so that there is a complete product to share.










Modern languages - English as an Additional Language (EAL)

The teacher talks less. The learners talk more. That's because deeper understanding grows as a learner tries to explain what is in their head.

Teachers ask 'rich' questions. The conversations in an inquiry classroom are rich with quality questions – inquiry teachers know how to use questions to help students uncover their own thinking and understanding.

Teacher captures the learner's heart. We know what our learners love and we relate our lessons to those things that interest the children.

Teachers teach how to learn. We can't possibly know everything, and so we too are still learning. We lead the learners in how they can learn by themselves

A big part of the inquiry approach is learning how to learn.

In the second meeting of the year, the Board completed the appraisal of the Head of School for the 2018/2019 academic year and set targets for the 2019/2020 academic year. The Board then discussed strategy and planning for next year that would inform the approval of the new school budget for 2020/2021. The Board believed we needed to do better in marketing the benefits of the school to parents and suggested a regular climate survey to gauge parent perceptions. The Board also confirmed the plan to proceed step by step until the Diploma Programme (DP) which provides options for parents to continue with our style of learning until the end of high school. The Board then identified its work for the remainder of the year which includes finding new Board members and completing its technology plan amongst other things.

We have known for a long time that there will be a new International School in the area. Our school is very different, it's been very popular, and it provides access to best-practice education needed for our modern world.

PTA update - Summary of meeting held on Monday 20 January 2020 (2)

เรารู้มานานแล้วว่า จะมีโรงเรียนนานาชาติมาเปิดใหม่ ที่อุดร แต่เราเข้าใจในความแตกต่างของหลักสูตร และวิสัยทัศน์ของแต่ละโรงเรียนที่ไม่เหมือนกัน การเรียนแบบ **IB** เป็นหลักสูตรที่ยอมรับทั่วโลก และสามารถให้ผู้เรียนได้เรียนรู้ผ่านกิจกรรม ที่สามารถเข้าใจ แล้วนำมาปรับใช้ได้เป็นอย่างดีในโลกสมัยใหม่

Next we talked about the development of our UDIS campus in preparation for starting the MYP and the opening of our new Primary building. These include new classrooms, a science lab, a Design Technology lab specific arts spaces, a large meeting room, a full sized sports field, a new nurses room and improved parking facilities. We looked at an overview of a campus map which has been published in our recent newsletter
