K2: Creating our solar systems In our Unit of Inquiry, K2 has enjoyed learning about planets and the solar system. They kill only what they need to survive and they use every part of the animal for food, clothes and tools.The children have learned a traditional Inuit dance to perform at our Global Winter Festival.



Y7/8: Dutch pancakes In Mr. Barend's class our Year 7/8 Language Acquisition students were learning how to create Dutch pancakes. During this lesson the students were developing their vocabulary skills and English speaking skills by creating their own cooking videos and demonstrations.
