Chinese New Year at UDIS



K2: The digestive system

K2 has been learning about the digestive system and how their lunch is digested. They used zip bags and soda to simulate how food is broken down in the stomach with help from stomach acid. Next week, the students will be using tights to mimic how food passes through the intestines to create poo! Yuck!



Y2: Plant survivors

Year 2 have been exploring plants in Science over the last few weeks. We have designed an experiment to see what happens to plants if they don't get everything they need to survive and making predictions about what may happen.



Y4: Environmental impacts

Year 4 has been learning about how human activity can change our environment in both positive and negative ways. They illustrated this by building dioramas. They showed an area of natural beauty in Diorama 1 which was set in 1993. Diorama 2 showed the same location thirty years later in 2023, These dioramas were shared in our End Of Unit Showcase.

In performing arts, Y9/10 learners have been experimenting with rhythm and beat. This is part of our MYP arts curriculum where students are learning not only to respond to different performing arts but to also take part in creating performing art pieces themselves.
