Our Senior School students took part in our first international sporting competition in Vientiane on Saturday 11 January. K2: Learning through play in maths

Year 2: Becoming young engineers



Year 2 students became young engineers as they built DIY hovercrafts using cardboard, bottle caps, and balloons. They tested their creations on various surfaces, including tile, carpet, and grass, to investigate how friction affects movement. Students then reflected on ways to improve their designs, sparking creativity and critical thinking. It was a hands-on and exciting way to explore science in action!

Year 4: Investigating fractions

The student's have been investigating the very tricky topic of fractions. We are currently finding out how to order fractions depending on their value. The learners can now convert improper fractions into mixed numbers. During our PSPE lessons the class have been sharing their feelings and ideas about racial discrimination and how they can change the way others judge people. Learners shared their ideas with our guest speaker Mr. Thomas.

















Year 6: Scientific advancements

The Year 6 students have started their new unit on scientific advancements. Last week they were able to go to the lab with Ms. Daphnie to discuss and learn about how to plan a science investigation. This will help students as they prepare to go to Year 7 and the Middle Years next year.

Senior School: Hexagonal thinking

Our Year 7-8 learners are inquiring into the visual representation of different concepts and their connections through the hexagonal thinking strategy, through which they developed their thinking, social skills and their inquirer attribute.





Year 9/10 are working on creating their Kites in Design and technology. They have previously researched the best methods of construction, materials and design practices to create their own models.
